Through the Division of Research Programs, NEH assists scholars who are engaged in examining ideas, making inquiries, and assembling evidence that leads to a better understanding of human thought, societies, and cultures worldwide.

Their projects are often journeys into archival sources to discover and make available previously inaccessible material. In the newly reconstituted Scholarly Editions program, for example, a 2003 grant was awarded to C. James Taylor at the Massachusetts Historical Society to prepare a four-volume edition of the Adams family correspondence, focusing on John Adams, Abigail Adams, John Quincy Adams, and Charles Francis Adams. This edition highlights the thoughts, emotions, and often lively expressions of this family important to the founding period, the early republic, and the nineteenth century.

Within the Collaborative Research Program, the division supports long-term research ranging from archaeological projects to scholarly conferences, biographies, and linguistic and literary endeavors. A 2003 grant went to James Packer of Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois, to continue his excavation of the Theater of Pompey, the largest and most famous theater of Imperial Rome, and the prototype for Roman amphitheaters. Through photography, excavation, and study of the landscape and architectural fragments, the investigators are constructing plans and models of the theater.


At the Winterthur Museum in Wilmington, Delaware, a 2003 award assists scholars who wish to use the museum's collections in American cultural, social, and intellectual history. The grant is through Fellowship Programs at Independent Research Institutions (FPIRI). Winterthur is a multifaceted organization consisting of a

museum, gardens, and research facilities dedicated to understanding and appreciating American art and material culture. The FPIRI program supports similar U.S.-chartered institutions as well as overseas centers of American organizations, which expand American scholars' access to important collections and scholarly communities abroad. In 2003 the Endowment supported fellowships at thirteen research institutions in the United States and fourteen institutions that facilitate international research.

Fellowships, summer stipends, and faculty research awards also provide support for humanities research. In 2003 Carter Findley, a professor of history at Ohio State University, was awarded a Fellowship to prepare a book on Turkish nationalism and modernity in Turkey during the past two hundred years. Findley considers Turkish history in light of its interaction with European-influenced military and political institutions. His book sheds light on Turkey's singular position between Europe and Asia.

A summer stipend was awarded to Anne Helmreich, who teaches art history at Texas Christian University, for a study of "The Modern Landscape in British Painting, 1870–1920." Through landscape paintings, British artists responded to suburbanization, industrialization, and war as well as changing attitudes toward nature based on new scientific discoveries. Helmreich emphasizes the contrast between a British artistic tradition, as represented by John Constable and J. M. W. Turner, and modernism, Impressionism, and Postimpressionism.

Faculty research awards support faculty at historically black colleges and universities, Hispanic-serving institutions, and tribal colleges. Virginia Beavert of Heritage College

in Washington, and a former member of the Yakima General Tribal Council, is one of the few remaining native speakers of Sahaptin, a northwestern dialect of Yakim. She received an award in 2003 to compile the first Yakima Sahaptin-English dictionary in collaboration with a colleague at the University of Washington, Seattle. Beavert is also transcribing and digitizing a large set of Sahaptin texts that will preserve the tribal heritage for both scholars and members of the community.

During 2003, 128 books resulted from NEH-funded research. Among them were a number of prize winners. Two received Columbia University's distinguished Bancroft Prize: James F. Brooks's *Captive and Cousins: Slavery, Kinship, and Community in the Southwest Borderlands*, and Alan Gally's *The Indian Slave Trade: The*

Rise of the English Empire in the American South, 1670–1717. Michael Willrich's *City of Courts: Socializing Justice in Progressive Era Chicago* received the American Historical Association's John H. Dunning Prize, while Priya Joshi's book *In Another Country: Colonialism, Culture, and the English Novel in India* was awarded the Modern Language Association's prize for the best first book written by a scholar.
