**About FedState** describes the overall work of our office, provides links to the guidelines for managing NEH grants to state humanities councils, and includes links to the legislation that founded the state humanities councils.

**Featured Projects** has extended stories with photographs of stellar projects carried out by state humanities councils. These projects appear on the first page of the Federal/State Partnership section of the NEH website. A new story appears almost every week. Featured projects also appear in FedState's monthly e-newsletter, along with other news about council activities.

**Grant News** covers the details of the ways state humanities councils interact officially with Federal/State Partnership. These include managing general operating support grants, annual compliance plans, the general liability insurance provided to councils by Federal/State Partnership, and the five-year assessment and review process.

**In the Field** highlights news from state humanities councils. The lead article, "56 Ways to do the Public Humanities," surveys the varieties of humanities work done by councils. The attachments to this article include, among other things, council work done with specific kinds of audiences and cultural institutions.

**E-Newsletter Archive** records all of Federal/State Partnership's monthly e-newsletters.

**Resources Library** provides information about the NEH/ALA reading and discussion series "Making Sense of the American Civil War" and articles and links about nonprofit management and grantmaking.
