



## DIVISION OF PRESERVATION AND ACCESS

Through the Division of Preservation and Access, NEH combats the physical deterioration of humanities collections in America's libraries, museums, archives, and historical organizations, ensuring access to these collections for research, education, and public programming.

## Preservation and Access Grants

*Grants assist in the care of humanities collections and in the availability for use by the public.*

**\$349,874** The continued creation of a union catalog of all books, pamphlets, and broadsides printed before 1877 in the United States and Canada. This project would enhance 7,150 records and create 500 new records for imprints from the period 1801 through 1820.

**\$241,945** The completion of a database of American electoral returns from 1788 through 1825, which would enable the study of electoral participation, democratization, and party development in the early Republican era.

**\$4,027** A general preservation assessment and development of long-term preservation plans for archival records from 206 churches as well as 1200 periodicals, 550 linear feet of sermons, 160 hymn and tune books, and an array of other materials related to the history of the Congregational Church in America from the eighteenth century to the 1980s.

**\$13,000\*** The digital reformatting of 2,600 hours of Radio Afghanistan analog music tapes created from 1960 to 1980 that document a significant period of Afghan history and culture.

**\$62,231** The digitization and mounting on the Internet of 500 oral history transcripts and brief audio excerpts of interviews with notable physical scientists.

**\$350,000** The digital imaging of 25,021 ethnographic artifacts and associated data from Mexico and South America documenting more than 200 ethnic groups from Amazonian, Andean Highlands, Gran Chaco, Mexican, and Tierra del Fuego culture areas.

**\$16,689\*** The preparation of two volumes of *l'Année philologique*, a comprehensive bibliography of research in all fields of classical studies.

**\$50,000\*** The installation of fire and security systems in Library Hall for the protection of the society's resources in early American history and the history of science and technology, as well as manuscripts and printed materials documenting the cultural and intellectual heritage of the nation.

**\$3,331** The purchase of supplies and equipment to store collections housed in the 1846 National Historic Landmark Robbins and Lawrence Armory, an international engineering heritage site.

**\$550,000** A regional field service program that provides workshops, consultations, preservation surveys, disaster response assistance, reference services, and educational materials on preservation and digitization to libraries, archives, and cultural heritage organizations in the Southwest.

**\$5,000** Environmental monitoring at eight historic house museums, which house and display nearly 10,000 historical and decorative objects and 400 linear feet of archival materials that document four centuries of domestic architecture and family life in Connecticut.

**\$40,000\*** The digitization of 10,000 45-rpm records in the Frontera Collection of Mexican and Mexican-American Recordings, the creation of images of the record labels and a finding aid, and the mounting of the audio recordings on the bilingual UCLA Digital Library website.

**\$30,000\*\*** The safeguarding of datasets of geographically coded cross-cultural analyses of singing, dance, and speech. This data from regions around the world was developed over the course of three decades by Alan Lomax and his colleagues in musicology, dance, anthropology, and linguistics.

**\$340,000** Digital imaging and cataloging of 15,000 California Indian ethnographic objects, archaeological artifacts, and sound recordings from the collections of the Southwest Museum.

**\$333,000** A regional preservation field service program that provides preservation surveys, workshops, technical consultations, and educational materials to museums and historical organizations in California, Arizona, Oregon, and Washington.

**\$408,000** Forty workshops on disaster preparedness and response that would result in disaster plans for up to 450 libraries and archives in ten western states and three Pacific territories.

**\$5,000** A general preservation assessment of manuscripts, postcards, 250 photographs, and 200 books related to the twentieth-century history of watermen and the bivalve harvesting industry in the New Jersey areas of the Delaware Bay.

**\$5,000** A workshop to train staff in the care of materials that document the history and culture of the tribe including archaeological artifacts, oral histories, manuscripts, and recordings of Yokut and Paiute songs.

**\$5,000** The purchase of storage supplies and environmental monitoring equipment for archival records, books, pamphlets, microfilm, audiotapes, and newspapers that document the town's history, including the development of its early mills and canals.

**Boston College**Chestnut Hill, MA *Steve Dalton*

**\$4,080** Consultation to devise a preservation program for the library's existing and future digital collections. The library houses special and archival collections related to Irish and British studies, including manuscripts by literary figures such as William Butler Yeats, Hilaire Belloc, and Graham Greene, as well as works published by or about the Jesuits, and materials that document Catholic liturgical movements in America.

**Boston Public Library**Boston, MA *Ronald E Grim*

**\$135,000** Conservation treatment of 750 maps, including 500 bird's-eye view maps, and fifty atlases from the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, focusing on the Boston area. The maps would receive conservation treatment—cleaning, repairing tears, etc.—and be rehoused in appropriate containers and enclosures. The maps would also be digitized and made available on the Internet.

**\$4,998** A preservation assessment of records, manuscripts, and oral histories relating to the history of the town of Brewster from 1799 to the present, with additional support for archival supplies and workshop training for staff in the care of photographs and scrapbooks.

**\$250,005** Twelve workshops for a total of 300–400 humanities faculty and graduate students that will explore digital text encoding as an essential method in humanities scholarship.

**\$332,823** Incorporating three early twentieth-century periodicals, *The English Review*, *Scribner's*, and *Poetry: A Magazine of Verse*, into a digital archive, the Modernist Journals Project.

**\$4,660** The purchase of archival supplies and the training of staff and volunteers in procedures for handling and storing photographs, documents, and artifacts that document the growth of the cranberry and blueberry industries in the historic village of Whitesbog.

**\$5,000** Hiring a preservation consultant to assess the film and videotape collection and preservation plan of CalArts, an organization that houses and provides access to experimental and independent moving image animation created from the 1920s to the present.

**\$5,000** The purchase of environmental monitoring equipment to assess the effects of relative humidity, temperature, and light on collections that document the history and technology of railroads and railroading in California and the Western states from the 1850s to the present.

**\$5,000** Hiring an archivist to conduct a general preservation assessment of 500,000 sound recordings in a variety of formats, one million still image negatives, and periodicals comprising the collection of the California Institute for the Preservation of Jazz, a state-wide organization headquartered at the university.

**\$306,528** Educational programs focused on the care of humanities collections for staff of museums, libraries, and historical organizations.

**\$348,885** The cataloging, conservation, creation of finding aids, and mounting on the Internet of 26,963 images that document African-American history and culture in Pittsburgh from 1935 to 1975.

**\$350,000** Microfilm reformatting of 500,000 pages of Latin-American newspapers held in United States repositories, the cataloging of Latin-American newspaper holdings at partner institutions, and the expansion and enhancement of a database of international newspapers.

**\$5,000** A general preservation assessment of manuscripts, documents, photographs, drawings, maps, books, and deeds, wills, death certificates and other vital records related to the history of Fredericksburg, Virginia, and surrounding area from the 1720s to the 1990s.

**\$4,975** Hiring a consultant to assist in developing and implementing an emergency preparedness plan. Among the society's 80,000 objects are furniture built in the 1730s, agricultural tools and equipment, nineteenth-century needlework samplers, scientific equipment, Revolutionary and Civil War surgeon kits, paintings by Benjamin West, Bass Otis, and Andrew Wyeth, photographs, and library resources.

**\$5,000** A preservation assessment of a moving image collection comprising 5,500 films, created in various formats between 1911 and 1990, that focus on the American Midwest; supplies approved by the consultant would also be purchased.

**\$3,000** A general preservation assessment of correspondence, photographs, and other records related to the history of the Second Baptist Church of Los Angeles, the Civil Rights Movement, Black primary education, and the development of the African-American community in Los Angeles from the 1880s to the present.

**\$4,920** The purchase of dataloggers to monitor temperature, relative humidity, and light levels in the collections areas of the art museum.

**\$3,092** The attendance of a curator at a workshop on the preservation and care of image collections and the purchase of supplies to rehouse 4,698 photographs in a museum collection centered on the history of Weld County, Colorado.

**\$4,851** Hiring preservation consultants to assess the City of Las Vegas Museum and Rough Rider Collection of 2,400 still images dating from the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, to conduct a two-day workshop on this media for the staffs of other small museums in New Mexico and the purchase of supplies to rehouse the photographs.

**\$60,000** Conservation treatment and rehousing of 2,482 manuscripts, including letters and journals of Washington, Jefferson, Hamilton, Adams, and other prominent figures from the American Revolution, 1774 to 1800.

**\$5,000** The purchase of archival supplies and storage furniture to rehouse the university museum's collection of Chinese rubbings of shrines and temples of the Han, Tang, Song, and Qing Dynasties.

**\$113,100** Technological upgrades to the society's security system to preserve 200,000 artifacts reflecting the history of Detroit.

**\$30,000\*\*** Recovery and conservation of the Peabody Collection, Georgetown Neighborhood Library.

**Ella Sharp Museum**

**\$5,000** Purchasing preservation boxes and materials to rehouse textiles in the museum's newly renovated storage area.

**\$5,000** The purchase of supplies and furniture to house archival materials in Ellwood House, built in 1879 by Isaac Ellwood, one of the first manufacturers of barbed wire. The home was occupied until 1964 by several generations of the Ellwood family and contains original furnishings, art, accessories, textiles, tools, business papers, diaries, photographs, maps, ledgers, and other archival materials.

**\$280,369** The mass deacidification of 6,500 volumes, the cataloging of 4,000 volumes, and the rehousing of embrittled materials from the Danowski Poetry Library.

**\$5,000** A preservation assessment of the club's collections, which include manuscripts, film, photographs, books, and maps on exploration and travel in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries as well as the institution's records since 1904. Many of the archival materials relate to the history of Arctic exploration, including the Lady Franklyn Bay Expedition of 1881.

**Fifth Maine Regiment Museum**

**\$1,139** The purchase of shelving and supplies for the storage of Civil War holdings and materials that document the history of Peaks Island from the mid-1700s to the present. Three recently acquired collections of photographs, uniforms, weapons, equipment, household artifacts, and archival materials will be rehoused in a newly created storage room.

**Flannery O'Connor-Andalusia Foundation**  
Milledgeville, GA *Craig Ross Amason*

**\$5,000** A preservation assessment of collections at Andalusia, the family farm where Flannery O'Connor lived for thirteen years, until her death in 1964. The ten-room house contains furniture, household accessories, photographs, and documents.

### **Franklin County Historical and Museum Society**

**\$4,850** Preservation assessment of archival records, daybooks, ledgers, scrapbooks, registers, maps, and other materials related to the cultural, political, agricultural, and business history of Franklin County, New York, from the 1820s to the 1970s.

### **Freeport Historical Society**

**\$5,000** The purchase of storage shelving, supplies, and environmental monitoring equipment for the care of collections in Harrington House (1830). These historical artifacts and archival materials document the history of Freeport, Maine, from 1750 to the present.

### **Frelinghuysen Morris Foundation**

**\$5,000** Development of a long-range preservation plan to guide the care of collections at the Frelinghuysen Morris House and Studio, which was home to abstract artists George L.K. Morris (1905–1975) and Suzy Frelinghuysen (1911–1988). The collection includes their own art as well as works by such artists as Braque, Matisse, Arp, Leger, and Gris, along with extensive archival materials and household furnishings.

### **Fremont Indian State Park and Museum**

**\$5,000** The purchase of preservation supplies and environmental monitoring equipment to care for the museum's archaeological holdings, excavated from sites around Clear Creek Canyon in central Utah. The majority of the collection is from the Five Finger Ridge site, a large Indian village dating from CE 1200 to 1350.

### **General John A. Logan Museum**

**\$5,000** A general conservation assessment of collections that examine the life of General John Logan (1826–1886), who volunteered for the Mexican War in 1846, became a volunteer general in the Civil War, and then pursued a political career that led from county clerk to U.S. Senator. The museum's collections include household furnishings, military memorabilia, photographs, maps, and correspondence.

### **George Mason University**

**\$349,781** The development of a collaborative, bilingual, online archive documenting the Bracero Program, which brought Mexican guest workers to the United States between 1942 and 1964.

### **GRACE**

Hardwick, VT *Carol A. Putnam*

**\$5,000** A preservation assessment of storage conditions and a conservation assessment for a collection of 1,300 artworks by Vermont contemporary folk artist, Gayleen Aiken.

### **Harriet Beecher Stowe Center**

**\$100,000** Installation of climate control and fire suppression systems to preserve the material culture, library and archival collections that are stored and displayed in the historic houses relating to the life of Harriett Beecher Stowe, her family, and American society in the nineteenth century.

### **Harry S Truman Library Institute**

**\$125,000** A preservation assessment and installation of a new climate control system to ensure the long-term preservation of artifacts in the post-presidential office of Harry S Truman. The collections include the former president's books, office furniture, personal belongings, photographs, and family mementos.

**\$256,390** The creation of an authoritative common-base geographic information system for Chinese history from 221 BCE to 1911 CE, in collaboration with Fudan University of Shanghai.

### **Heritage Museums and Gardens**

**\$4,489** A conservation assessment of 102 Currier & Ives lithographs and the preparation of a treatment plan for their preservation.

### **Historic Charleston Foundation**

Charleston, SC *Karen Brickman Emmons*

**\$896** The purchase of a storage cabinet and archival supplies to rehouse historic Sanborn fire insurance maps, documenting buildings and properties in Charleston in 1866.

### **Historic House Trust of New York City**

New York, NY *Sandra Elaine Huber*

**\$4,500** Consultation with a preservation expert who will review environmental monitoring data and recommend actions to improve conditions in the Trust's historic house museums. Four properties have been selected for analysis: the Alice Austen House Museum (ca. 1690) on Staten Island with nineteenth-century contents that document Austen's life as a prolific photographer; the Dyckman Farmhouse Museum (1784), the last surviving farmhouse in Manhattan; Lefferts Historic House, an eighteenth-century Dutch-American farmhouse that focuses on Brooklyn family life; and Merchant's House Museum (1832), with its nineteenth-century household and textile collections.

### **Historical Society of Palm Beach County**

Palm Beach, FL *Loren Alexander Mintz*

**\$5,000** A general preservation assessment of the historical society's books, photographs, maps, newspapers, journals, periodicals, architectural drawings, furniture, art objects, artifacts, and textiles. Most of the materials date from the 1870s to the late twentieth century. Among the rarest objects is a pre-Columbian, wooden human effigy that has been dated to between CE 900 to 1200.

### **Historical Society of Pennsylvania**

**\$347,520** Development of PhilaPlace, an interactive web resource on the history, culture, and architecture of Philadelphia's neighborhoods. The Historical Society of Pennsylvania, the Philadelphia Department of Records, and the University of Pennsylvania's School of Design would work with neighborhood organizations to develop a prototype website focused initially on two neighborhood clusters. In addition to historical records, maps, and photographs, the site will include an in-depth Geographic Information System model of Southwark, a neighborhood with a 300-year history as a center of industry, transportation, and immigration.

**\$135,620** Arranging, describing, conserving, and rehousing 400 linear feet of records of the Chew family of Philadelphia covering the period from 1760 to the present.

**\$17,138\*** The purchase of storage furniture and supplies to rehouse 5,000 linear feet of archival and manuscript collections related to the history of California's Santa Clara Valley from 1777 to the present.

**\$261,852** Arrangement and description of ninety linear feet of archives, including 80,000 photographs, correspondence, and business records created by Maynard L. Parker (1900–1996), noted photographer of American architecture and landscapes. The project would also digitize a selection of 5,000 photographs for mounting on the Internet.

**Idaho State Historical Society**

**\$5,000** A preservation assessment of 50,000 cubic feet of manuscripts and archival records, 30,000 rolls of microfilm, 500,000 photographs, 5,000 films and videotapes, 3,100 oral histories, 32,000 maps, and 25,000 books and periodicals related to the state's political, cultural, and social history from the mid-nineteenth century to the 1990s.

**Indiana University of Pennsylvania Research Institute**

**\$4,710** A preservation assessment of records and artifacts created or owned by the Rochester and Pittsburgh Coal Company, the largest mining operation in Southwestern Pennsylvania, from 1881 to the end of the twentieth century. Among the rare items in this collection are maps that document digging activity in the mine and property lines above ground since 1886.

**\$349,910** The implementation and testing of a paradigm of best practices devised in a previous NEH research and development project for preserving analog sound recordings by converting them to digital form.

**\$228,436** Preparation of *Gothic Sculpture in America*, volume 3 of a four-volume descriptive catalog of medieval sculpture in public collections in the United States.
