



## IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR ARKANSAS

**Grants to Arkansas Organizations and Individuals from Fiscal Year 2019 through 2023 – \$9,119,603**

**Total Number of Awards – 35**

### **Award Highlights:**

- The Alex Foundation will host 60 K-12 teachers from across the country for a continuing education program over the summer. The curriculum will focus on the architecture, culture, and history of the Arkansas Delta.
- Arkansas State Archives will digitize more than 100,000 pages of Arkansas newspapers published from 1819 to the mid-1930s. As they continue to expand their collection of historic newspapers, the archives will focus on digitizing the Arkansas Gazette and highlighting the evolving relationship between the economy and the environment.

**NEH also provides annual funding to [HumanitiesAR](#), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.**

### **Recent HumanitiesAR Highlights:**

- The council hosted its first-ever residential HumanitiesAR History Teacher Institute in June 2023. The free event welcomed 20 educators with diverse backgrounds from across the state, chosen from a highly competitive application process. The Institute opened doors to the past and provided educators with the tools to teach their students about the rich tapestry of Arkansas's history.
- HumanitiesAR awarded 60 grants to individuals and nonprofit organizations in 25 counties across Arkansas. The funded programs impacted more than 800,000 Arkansans.
