Grants to Colorado Organizations and Individuals from Fiscal Years 2019 through 2023 – \$15,250,471

Award Highlights:

- The town of La Veta is conducting a preservation risk assessment for the Francisco Fort Museum. This will allow the museum to train staff in emergency preparedness, toward the goal of developing an emergency plan for the Francisco Fort Museum, which is located in an area prone to wildfires and severe flooding.
- Rachel Gross, Cameron Blevins, and Michelle Comstock of the University of Colorado are creating a digital tour of the displaced neighborhood of Auraria. The project will produce new digital and curricular materials related to the university's development and impact on its neighborhood.

NEH also provides annual funding to Colorado Humanities, the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent Colorado Humanities Highlights:

- The Five States of Colorado, a documentary designed to inform and serve as the basis for community and classroom discussions, is an engaging and informative exploration of the five featured regions of Colorado. The film is being shown in communities statewide with accompanying facilitated discussions and will be distributed along with a teacher resource packet to libraries and schools.
- Young Chautauqua is a research, writing, and public speaking workshop series led by professional Chautauqua (living history) presenters for elementary, middle and high school students who create first-person presentations of historical figures.
