Award Highlights:

- Oregon State University received an NEH grant to create a facility centered on two laboratories for digital 3D scanning and artifact analysis. This new infrastructure, the Center for Archaeology, Art History, and Artifacts, and will support the College of Liberal Arts and OSU's Indigenous Studies program.
- Working to expand its Higher Education in Prison Program, Portland State University received an NEH grant to design and implement a humanities curriculum around the theme of Identity, Transformation and Agency. This curriculum, for Oregon's only women's prison, includes faculty from PSU's Anthropology, Black Studies, Chicano & Latino Studies, English, Indigenous Nations Studies, and Philosophy departments.

NEH also provides annual funding to [Oregon Humanities](#), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent Oregon Humanities Highlight:

- Through its magazine, radio program, and online essay series, Oregon Humanities shared stories about the lives and ideas of Oregonians past and present with more than 250,000 readers and listeners. The long-running Conversation Project brought people together across differences of belief and background in more than two dozen communities—and many more online—for facilitated discussions on subjects such as housing, aging, and urban/rural divides.
