## IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR COLORADO

**Grants to Colorado Organizations and Individuals in 2022,  
including from the *American Rescue Plan* – \$3,040,406**

**Number of Grantees – 22**

### **Recent Project Highlights:**

- The University of Colorado, Boulder, received a \$109,939 grant to research the rich musical heritage of Pueblo. Project contributors will conduct community interviews to create a free digital archive of interviews and performances highlighting the understudied music of the American West.
- The State Historical Society of Colorado received a grant to support the production of Season 4 of *Lost Highways: Dispatches from the Shadows of the Rocky Mountains*, a podcast about the overlooked history of the Rocky Mountain West. It will feature eight episodes that explore myths and reality of the West.

**NEH also provides annual funding to [Colorado Humanities](#), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.**

### **Recent Colorado Humanities Highlights:**

- Through the A More Perfect Union Initiative, Colorado Humanities updated the documentary film, *The Five States of Colorado*, which examines five diverse regions and their influence in shaping the state. It will be made freely available to every public, school, and academic library in Colorado.
- Colorado Humanities is launching a series of panel discussions entitled *Changing the Legacy of Race & Ethnicity*. These conversations will focus on Colorado Indigenous experiences and contributions, innovative housing solutions, culturally relevant health care, voting rights, and equity in education.
