IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR ARIZONA

including from the *American Rescue Plan* – \$6,072,403**

Number of Grantees – 32

Recent Project Highlights:

- The University of Arizona received \$189,999 to organize an institute on immigration to the U.S. as understood through the history and literature of Arizona. It places the formation of Arizona as a territory, and then a state, into the context of national and global migration experiences.
- The Frank Lloyd Wright Foundation was awarded \$290,000 for a Sustaining Cultural Heritage Collection grant to maintain the building systems and collections of Wright's Taliesin West home and studio. Taliesin West, a UNESCO World Heritage site and National Historic Landmark, receives several thousand visitors annually.

NEH also provides annual funding to [Arizona Humanities](#), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent Arizona Humanities Highlights:

- Partnered with the Arizona State Library, Archives & Public Records to sponsor [FRANK Talks](#) around the state. The program brings trained facilitators to lead small group discussions in person and virtually to encourage open discussion in a safe, moderated space.
- Worked with Mountain View Elementary to support literacy through a year-long initiative with kindergartners and their parents, celebrating each child's birthday with breakfast and story time.
