Recent Project Highlights:

- The Cotsen Institute of Archaeology at the University of California, Los Angeles, received a grant to support a general preservation assessment of newly acquired archaeological and ethnographic materials that date from prehistory through the 20th century. The collections include 323 objects from across the world. These collections will be used in two new courses: Archaeology and the Conservation of Cultural Heritage.
- The University of Southern California received a grant to support a documentary titled *Voces de las Abuelas: Grandmothers' Food Stories from the Borderlands*. This documentary tells the stories of three grandmothers (abuelas) in Los Angeles, and their journey with Mexican-American food.

NEH also provides annual funding to [California Humanities](#), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent California Humanities Highlight:

- *Cultivating Cultural Understanding of Forests, Fire, & Relationships* is a traveling interpretive exhibit that helps viewers better understand the Sierra Nevada Forest, its relationship with fire, and the job of stewardship. This exhibition is available in English, Spanish, and Washoe.
