## **IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR KANSAS**

**Grants to Kansas Organizations and Individuals in 2022,  
including from the *American Rescue Plan* – \$ 2,426,059**

**Number of Grantees – 15**

### **Recent Project Highlights:**

- Newman University received a \$148,815 NEH award for the continued development of an Emphasis in Technology and Human Values (ETHV) program, which integrates humanities content from general education programs into degree requirements of professional majors. The grant allows for additional tracks in the program: biology, psychology, education, and social work.
- Marike Janzen, Associate Professor at the University of Kansas, received a \$6,000 NEH Summer Stipend. She will study how state-funded literary initiatives in Germany affect the hundreds of thousands of refugees that arrive in the country each year.

**NEH also provides annual funding to [Humanities Kansas](#), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.**

### **Recent Humanities Kansas Highlights:**

- Humanities Kansas's *21st Century Civics* initiative consists of speakers, book discussions, exhibits, and opportunities that invite Kansans to participate in 21st-century civics and learn more about the history of American democracy and the shared responsibilities of citizenship.
- The council hosted an online conference called *Sounds of Sovereignty* to explore Indigenous American audio journalism, from radio to podcasts and the future of audio media. The conference featured nationally and internationally renowned Indigenous podcasters, broadcasters, producers, editors, and media scholars.
