Recent Project Highlights:

- Faculty at the University of Missouri received a grant to develop a new course to study and address feelings of separation between military veterans and their civilian communities. The course will engage student-veteran instructors to share their experiences with non-veteran classmates as they discuss novels, memoirs, films and other materials.
- NEH awarded a grant to a University of Missouri team that is building software that will provide a speedy and accurate search function for 17th-century Spanish American notary records. When fully developed, this new technology can be used to process and analyze other archival manuscripts.

NEH also provides annual funding to [Missouri Humanities](#), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent Missouri Humanities Highlights:

- Through conversations, films, and podcasts, Missouri Humanities’ “Eat, Think, and Be Merry” program examined the role that food plays in Missouri’s cultural heritage and history.
- The council’s Native American program uses in-person and virtual experiences to connect with Missouri’s Native American heritage, including mapping the Trail of Tears through the state.
