Recent Project Highlights:

- The University of New Mexico received a \$50,000 Collaborative Research grant to hold the first of a series of international conferences on Indigenous borderlands, crossings, histories, and futures. The goal is, through cross-disciplinary and community-based conversations, to shape new ways of thinking about these places in the context of social and environmental change.
- The National Hispanic Cultural Center received a \$350,000 Humanities Collection Implementation grant to undertake a three-year project to digitize, describe, and make accessible a large concentration of Mexican-American art and related documents.

NEH also provides annual funding to the [New Mexico Humanities Council](#), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent New Mexico Humanities Highlights:

- New Mexico Listens is a statewide program through NEH's *A More Perfect Union* initiative. It is focused on strengthening civic engagement and restoring faith in our democracy through community conversations on multiple topics.
- The Atlas of Historic New Mexico Maps is a rich resource for exploring four centuries of New Mexico history through the lens of historic maps and the people that made them. Created as part of the centennial celebration of New Mexico's statehood, the project includes slideshows, audio, timelines, full-text materials, and printable maps.
