Recent Project Highlights:

- The Buffalo Society of Natural Sciences, with an NEH grant, is digitizing almost 2000 nitrate image negatives taken between 1920-1940, securing their content and transforming a currently unstable and inaccessible collection of images into an available resource for research, publication, exhibition, and programming.
- The Brooklyn Children's Museum will create *Brooklyn Time Machine*, a permanent exhibition exploring 400 years of Brooklyn's history through a 25-foot high, three-level climbing structure for children ages 5 to 12. Chutes, ladders, fire poles, stairs, and ramps will allow visitors to "time travel" between the exhibition's three levels representing underground, the street, and the sky.

NEH also provides annual funding to <u>Humanities New York</u> (HNY), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent Humanities New York Highlights:

- *Liberty, Land, and Loss: Echoes of the American Revolution* is a new, scholarguided reading and discussion series, curated and introduced by Pulitzer Prizewinning historian Alan Taylor, exploring the struggle for equality in America.
- The Humanities Centers Initiative (HCI) is a statewide partnership between HNY and a network of humanities centers at nine NY State universities. The HCI supports humanities institutes, faculty, and graduate students in their commitment to public engagement.
