Recent Project Highlights:

- The Albany Regional Museum, which houses exhibits on the history, culture, and heritage of the area, received a grant to collect data about the environmental conditions throughout its space. With this data, the museum will be able to adjust its exhibits to ensure long-term preservation of the displayed objects.
- Building off its School of Global Studies and Languages, the University of Oregon received a grant to develop a new undergraduate interdisciplinary major track: Global Public Humanities (GPH). The grant will support new public humanities courses and a capstone experiential course intended to train students in communicating the importance of humanities work to various audiences.

NEH also provides annual funding to [Oregon Humanities](#), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent Oregon Humanities Highlights:

- A five-part virtual discussion series, Democracy in America, was held to talk about what it means to be a democratic citizen in the United States and attempted to bridge the divides, both large and small, that exist in our communities.
- Humanity in Perspective program provides free, for-credit, college-level courses for adults that face barriers to continuing education. Once the courses are complete, the credits are transferrable to Bard College.
