## **IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR UTAH**

**Grants to Utah Organizations and Individuals in 2022, including from the *American Rescue Plan* – \$ 1,849,847**

**Number of Grantees – 7**

### **Recent Project Highlights:**

- The University of Utah received a \$74,999 exhibition planning grant to develop the exhibit “From Jikji to Gutenberg: The Origins of Printing from Cast-Metal Type.” The exhibition will show the development of printing from movable type beginning in East Asia and as it developed independently in Western Europe.
- The Southern Utah Museum of Art, part of Southern Utah University, received a \$9,984 preservation assistance grant to help rehouse many of its artworks. The collection consists of a variety of pieces, such as mosaics, glasswork, ceramics, and sculpture from the late 1400s to the present.

**NEH also provides annual funding to [Utah Humanities](#), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.**

### **Recent Utah Humanities Highlights:**

- The Community Conversations program is an effort to bring the community together. Conversations are not lectures, panels, town halls, or presentations; they are actual conversations, which require active participation from those who participate. The program was created with the idea that facilitated conversation engages a community better than rhetoric or argument.
- The Clemente Course in the Humanities is an interdisciplinary course with units in philosophy, art history, U.S. history, and literature. The courses are intellectually rigorous, focus on significant multicultural works, and use primary documents, group discussion, writing, and collaborative projects as the basis for learning.
