## **IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR WISCONSIN**

**Grants to Wisconsin Organizations and Individuals in 2022,  
including from the *American Rescue Plan* – \$ 4,012,870**

**Number of Grantees – 27**

### **Recent Project Highlights:**

- The University of Wisconsin, Eau Claire, is using a \$150,000 grant from NEH to create a new health humanities certificate program. Faculty from the Institute for Health Sciences and the departments of English, history, languages, philosophy, biology, and social work will work together to engage students in an interdisciplinary examination of the human condition in healthcare.
- The University of Wisconsin, Madison, home of the American Institute of the History of Pharmacy, received a \$326,326 grant from NEH to catalog and digitize several thousands of artifacts in its collection, including letters, laboratory records, prescriptions, photographs, and advertisements.

**NEH also provides annual funding to [Wisconsin Humanities](#), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.**

### **Recent Wisconsin Humanities Highlights:**

- Wisconsin Humanities funded Fox Cities Reads, an annual community reading program that encourages residents of the Fox Cities to read and discuss the same book. The 2022 selection was *There There*, a Pulitzer Prize finalist about the lives of urban Native Americans.
- Love Wisconsin is a digital project by the Council that tells the stories of everyday people from across Wisconsin. By finding, collecting, and sharing these stories, Love Wisconsin connects strangers and creates a statewide sense of community.
