### Common Heritage




Grants support community-based public humanities projects that collect, preserve, and interpret the stories of America's cultural mosaic.

# During the Grant

- When should I contact NEH?
  - Changes in project scope, key personnel, certain budget issues
- Contact grants officer for:
  - Issues with eGMS
  - Project extensions
- Tell us about accomplishments, press coverage, etc.
  - NEH "Products & Prizes"
  - #NEHCommonHeritage hashtag



# Final Reporting

### Final performance report

- What happened (major activities)? Who was there (audience)?
- Changes from how project was proposed (goals, work plan, consultants)?
- Outcomes
- Media coverage
- Long-term impact (& other lasting outcomes)
- Final financial report (SF 425)



## Possible Impact Areas



- Improve understanding and appreciation of community and local history
- Raise preservation awareness & capacity
- Strengthen communityinstitution relationships
